The Public Policy Program at Stanford University is seeking to hire post-doctoral **Teaching Fellows** (who will have the academic rank of Lecturer) to assist with the graduate program in Public Policy. The appointment will be for the academic year, starting September 1, at .75 FTE, with the possibility of renewal. Fellows will work closely with the Public Policy Program Director to set the priorities and focus of their appointment. Job responsibilities may include but are not limited to the following duties:

- Teaching sections of the core curriculum courses
- Assisting with preparing and teaching the September “Boot Camp” refresher course for incoming Master’s students
- Advising Master’s students and monitoring their progress
- Assist with coordinating events, such as seminar series and special lectures, for faculty and students
- Assist in developing and running the Practicum course, acting as a liaison between students and local/national organizations.

Eligibility: Applicants must have completed all components of their PhD (no ABD candidates) or JD and have had some teaching experience. Strong preference will go to those with training in the fields of Political Science, Law, and Public Policy. Candidates also must have the ability to begin residence at Stanford prior to September 1, 2008.

Compensation: Fellows will earn between \$50,000 and \$70,000, plus benefits, dependent upon experience. Shared office space will be provided.

Those interested in applying for the Teaching Fellows position in Public Policy should submit the following materials:

- two confidential, sealed letters of recommendation from faculty members familiar with applicant's teaching experience and graduate studies. The letters should address the applicant’s experience as a teaching assistant or instructor.
- curriculum vitae
- official transcripts of all undergraduate and graduate work
- copies of course/teaching evaluations, if available
