- *Title*: "Trajectories of Social Role Occupancy and Health: An Intra-Individual Analysis of Role Growth, Loss, and Characteristics."

- *Summary*: This dissertation expands upon the classic role strain vs. role enhancement debate to consider how role dynamics, role characteristics, and stage in the life course affect the relationship between number of social roles and health. I use latent growth curve and latent class models to analyze the effect of trajectories of core work and family roles (parent, spouse, worker, and caregiver) on mortality and changes in depressive symptoms. Instead of asking whether people with higher or lower levels of social roles have different health outcomes, I reframe the question to ask whether changes in number and characteristics of roles improve or harm health, and whether age and cohort affect these relationships.
